

30. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Executive Officer was authorized to issue a permit to the Navy Department for the construction of a seawall along the south side of lands owned by the Navy lying easterly of the entrance to Hueneme Harbor. (No. 76, Public Resources Code)

31. The Commission deferred action on the request of the United States Department of the Interior, Bureau of Reclamation, for a grant deed covering 13.7 acres in the E $\frac{1}{2}$  of NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 16, T. 33 N., R. 4 W., M.D.M. (Sacramento office)

32. Upon motion duly made and carried, a resolution was adopted confirming the sale through the purchase of scrip (Applications E and F, Los Angeles) of the S $\frac{1}{2}$  of SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 17 and the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 19, T. 14 S., R. 1 E., S. B. M., containing 120 acres in San Diego County, for the sum of \$600.00. (Sacramento office)

33. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Commission passed a resolution authorizing the reconveyance to the United States of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 24, T. 3 S., R. 3 E., S. B. M., under State Indemnity Selection No. 10255 and the acceptance of deed as provided by Section 1158 of the Civil Code in order that the Document may be recorded by the County Recorder of San Bernardino County. (Sacramento office)

34. Upon motion duly made and carried, a resolution was adopted granting a Lease No. 1065 for a period of ten years on Fish Canyon Lot No. 6 to Harvel Guttenfelder, 1530 Cravens Avenue, Torrance, at an annual rental of \$30.00, such lease to be issued as of January 1, 1943. (Sacramento office)

35. Upon motion duly made and carried, a resolution was adopted authorizing the Executive Officer to cancel the contract dated May 8, 1942, with the State Mineralogist.

36. A letter was read from the State Controller in which he stated that the sum of \$150,000.00 should be transferred from the State Lands Act Fund to the General Fund and State Park Maintenance and Acquisition Fund in percents of 30 and 70, respectively.

Upon motion of Mr. Houser, seconded by Mr. Riley, and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted directing the transfer from the State Lands Act Fund in accordance with the suggestion of the State Controller.
