

13. (Application to Construct Loading Ramp and Do Certain Dredging - Montezuma Slough - Solano County - Standard Oil Company - No. P. R. C. 237) Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted confirming the contingent approval heretofore given to the Standard Oil Company by the Acting Executive Officer for a 6 months' permit for the construction of a loading ramp. The approval of this permit was subject to the Standard Oil Company agreeing to deposit any dredged spoils on State tide and submerged lands and further subject to the Company filing a surety bond in the sum of \$3,000.00 to guarantee removal of the ramp at the expiration of the permit. The temporary permit is to be issued at no consideration other than the \$5.00 filing fee. In the event any permanent structures are desired at this location or occupancy beyond the 6 month term of the permit, the company is to be required to lease the area occupied.

14. (Application for Mineral Leases - Extraction of Shell - Tide and Submerged Lands - San Francisco Bay) The Commission was informed that two applications have been received for lease of tide and submerged lands in San Francisco Bay for the extraction of oyster shell and that in consideration of the conflicts in the pertinent sections of the Public Resources Code, an Opinion of the Attorney General relative to the scope of the authority of the Commission to enter into such leases has been requested. Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted authorizing the Acting Executive Officer, upon receipt of the opinion of the Attorney General, to proceed to publish notice of intention to receive bids for a lease on the lands for which applications have been received. In the event that this procedure conforms with the opinion rendered or, alternatively, if it is ruled that a prospecting permit and subsequent preferential lease is the only permissible procedure, to issue a prospecting permit with a stated minimum royalty of 8 cents per ton of oyster shell for any preferential lease to be issued subsequent to discovery of commercially valuable deposits.

15. (Application for Right of Way Across Waddell Creek, Santa Cruz County, Division of Highways - No. P. R. C. 232) Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted authorizing the issuance of a right of way grant without charge to the Division of Highways over tide and submerged lands adjacent to Waddell Creek, Santa Cruz County for highway purposes, in accordance with the map and application submitted.
