

A meeting of the State Lands Commission was held in Room 301 State Building, Los Angeles, on April 14, 1948, at 10:00 A. M.

1. Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, the minutes of the meeting of the State Lands Commission held in Sacramento on March 19, 1948, were approved and confirmed as submitted.
2. Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, the matter of a date for the next meeting of the Commission was deferred for later determination of a specific date in May.
3. The Commission was informed that a request has been received, for further drilling deferment to that granted on February 6, 1948 (Minute Page 816, Item 7), from the Honolulu Oil Corporation, operator of Oil and Gas Lease No. P.R.C. 308, extending for a period of ninety days to July 17, 1948, the drilling and operating requirements of this lease for the reason that the further development work under Lease No. P.R.C. 309 which may furnish a basis for a future program under Lease P.R.C. 308, has not been completed, but is still being carried on diligently.

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted authorizing the Executive Officer to grant to Honolulu - Signal - Macco, Lessees under State Oil and Gas Lease No. 308, a deferment of drilling and operating requirements for a period of ninety days until July 17, 1948, within which to analyze current developments and to plan the future operations on the subject lease.

4. (Sale of Vacant School Land, Application No. 4640, Sacramento Land District - Glenn County - L. M. Westcamp) Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted authorizing the sale of the $W\frac{1}{2}$ of $W\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 36, T. 19 N., R. 6 W., M. D. M., containing 160 acres in Glenn County at a cash price of \$320.00 to L. M. Westcamp. Mr. Westcamp was the only bidder pursuant to the advertising. The land is to be sold subject to all statutory reservations including minerals.
5. (Grazing Lease Application No. P.R.C. 1192 - Tuolumne County - J. F. Dopplmaier) Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted authorizing the Executive Officer to execute and issue a five year grazing lease to Mr. J. F. Dopplmaier, the only bidder pursuant to the advertising, on the fractional $NE\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 16, T. 1 S., R. 15 E., M.D.M., containing 163.38 acres in Tuolumne County at an annual rental of \$.50 per acre, with the lessee to pay the first and last years' rental at the time of execution of the lease.
