the Commission has received a communication from Semator Charles Brown, and another from the laye County Assessor, Stewart R. Cox, advising that the City of Los Angeles' proposed exphange includes certain land adjacent to the meander line of Cwans Lake and others in the vicinity of Enimes Reservoir. Then this matter was heard before the laye County officials on July 20, 1951, Senator Brown informed the Dureau of Land Management and the City of Los Angeles that Inyo County and the State were opposed to the proposed exchange, and further that the matter would be brought to the attention of the State Lands Commission.

Senate at one time passed a resolution against the land moquisition by Los Angeles, and later agreed to a modified bill which did not affect the rights of the State, mining interests, and grazing rights.
