FINDS THAT SAID FEDERAL LAND IS NOT SUITABLE FOR CULTIVATION; THE COMMISSION SELECTS AND AUTHORIZES THE SALE OF SAID LAND, FOR CASH, TO CHARLES BROWN AT THE APPRAISED CASH PRICE OF \$520, SUBJECT TO ALL STATUTORY RESERVATIONS INCLUDING MINERALS, UPON THE LISTING (CONVEYANCE) OF SAID LAND TO THE STATE BY THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT.

45. (SALE OF VACANT FEDERAL LAND, OBTAINED THROUGH USE OF BASE, LIEU LAND APPLICATION NO. 5002, SACKAMENTO LAND DISTRICT, SHASTA COUNTY, LESLIE E. SHOUP - S.W.O. 5773.) The following report was presented to the Commission:

"An effer has been received from Leslie E. Shoup of Ono, California, to purchase Lots I and 4, Eg of NWt, Wg of NEt, NEt of NEt and NWt of SEt of Section 30, T. 31 N., R. 7 W., M.D.M., containing 322.47 acres in Shasta County. This land may be obtained by the State from the Federal Government through use of base. The applicant made an offer of \$1,612.35, or \$5 per acre.

"The Assessor of Shasta County has assessed contiguous land at \$3 to \$4 per acre, including timber situated thereon.

"An inspection and appraisal by a member of the Commission's staff on January 25, 1956 establishes the value of the subject land at \$68.40 per acre, including timber thereon. The applicant posted the necessary amount to meet this value. Said appraisal also indicates that said land is not suitable for cultivation without artificial irrigation.

The selection of the subject land is considered to be to the advantage of the State in that the selection thereof will assist the State in satisfying the loss to the School Land Grant and in addition will place said land on the tax rolls of the county in which it is situated,

"The State's application to select the land has been accepted by the Bureau of Land Management, and the land was listed (conveyed) to the State on December 30, 1955."

UPON HOTION DULY MADE AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED, IT WAS RESOLVED AS FOLIOWS:

THE COMMISSION DETERMINES THAT IT IS TO THE ADVANTAGE OF THE STATE TO SELECT THE FEDERAL LAND COMPRISED IN LOTS 1 AND 4, E2 OF NW2, W2 OF NB2, HB2 OF NB2 AND NW2 OF SB2 OF SECTION 30, T. 31 N., R. 7 W., M.D.M., CONTAINING 322.47 ACRES IN SHASTA COUNTY; THE COMMISSION FINDS THAT SAID FEDERAL LAND IS NOT SUITABLE FOR CULTIVATION; THE COMMISSION APPROVES THE SELECTION AND AUTHORIZES THE SALE OF SAID LAND, FOR CASH, TO LESLIE E. SHOUP AT THE APPRAISED CASH PRICE OF \$22,056.95, SUBJECT TO ALL STATUTORY RESERVATIONS INCLUDING MINERALS.

46. (SALE OF VACANT FEDERAL LAND, OBTAINED THROUGH USE OF BASE, LIEU LAND APPLICATION NO. 5003, SACPAMENTO LAND DISTRICT, SHASTA COUNTY, AVERIL L. BAKER - 3.W.O. 5774.) The following report was presented to the Commission:

"An offer has been received from Averil L. Baker of Ono, California, to purchase the Wa of NWA and NEt of NWA of Section 20 and NWA of Section 32, T. 31 N., R. 7 W., M.D.M., containing 280 acres in Shasta County. This land may be obtained by the State from the Federal Government through use of base. The applicant made an offer of \$1,600, or \$5.71+ per acre.

"The Assessor of Shasta County has assessed contiguous land at \$3 per acre including timber thereon.

"An inspection and appraisal by a member of the Commission's staff on January 26, 1956 establishes the value of the subject land at \$12.50 per acre, including timber thereon. The applicant posted the necessary amount to meet this value. Said appraisal also indicates that said land is not suitable for cultivation without artificial irrigation.

"The selection of the subject land is considered to be to the advantage of the State in that the selection thereof will assist the State in satisfying the loss to the School Land Grant and in addition will place said land on the tax rolls of the county in which it is situated.

"The State's application to select the land has been accepted by the Bureau of Land Management, and the land was listed (conveyed) to the State on December 30, 1955."

UPON MOTION DULY MADE AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED, IT WAS RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

THE COMMISSION DETERMINES THAT IT IS TO THE ADVANTAGE OF THE STATE TO SELECT THE FEDERAL LAND COMPRISED IN THE WY OF NWY AND NEW OF SECTION 20, APD NWY OF SECTION 32, T. 31 N., R. 7 W., M.D.M., CONTAINING 280 ACRES IN SHASTA COUNTY; THE COMMISSION FINDS THAT SAID FEDERAL LAND IS NOT SUITABLE FOR CULTIVATION; THE COMMISSION APPROVES THE SELECTION AND AUTHORIZES THE SALE OF SAID LAND, FOR CASH, TO AVERIL L. BAKER AT THE APPRAISED CASH PRICE OF \$3,500, SUBJECT TO ALL STATUTCRY RESERVATIONS INCLUDING MINERALS.
