A special meeting of the State Lands Commission was held in Room 5100 State Capitol, Sacramento, California, at 9 a.m. on Thursday, April 26, 1956.

1. (LONG BEACH TIDELANDS, CHAFTER 29, STATUTES OF 1956, 1ST EXTRAORDINARY SESSION - W. C. 2323.) The following report was presented to the Commission:

"By the enactment of Chapter 29, Statutes of 1956, 1st Extraordinary Session, which legislation carried an urgency clause which intended that it become effective immediately, the Legislature imposed on the State Lands Commission the duty of acting on the State's behalf in determining certain rights and interests of the State and the City of Long Beach in and to revenue from hydrocarbon substances extracted from tide and submerged lands conveyed in trust to the City under Statutes of 1911 and 1925. However, the office of the Attorney General and of the City Attorney of Long Beach have reached the conclusion that the effective date of the act is July 5, 1956.

"Despite whatever the effective date of the legislation may be, this measure assigns to the State Lands Commission "general responsibility in connection with the interests of the State" respecting: (1) The extraction of oil and gas from the granted lands; (2) the accounting for and distribution of all revenues resultant from such operations; (3) the planning for remedial work in connection with land subsidence in the Long Beach area; (4) the expenditure of designated portions of oil and gas revenues for such purpose; (5) the expenditure by the City of Long Beach of designated portions of such revenues for specified maintenance and improvements projects; (6) the issuance or amendment of leases or agreements relating to the extraction of hydrocarbon products from the granted lands; and (?) any other functions vested in the State Lands Commission by the terms of a proposed stipulation between the City of Long Beach and the State. By the terms of the

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legislation take-off dates for this assignment to the State Lands Commission begin February 1, 1956 and April 1, 1956. In consideration of the duties so assigned, and after consultation with officials of the City of Long Feach and the Long Beach Harbor District to review tasks and duties, the staff herewith presents for the Commission's consideration and approval the following requirements considered necessary to initiate this program."

UPON MOTION DULY MADE AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED, IT WAS RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER IS AUTHORIZED TO TAKE SUCH STEPS AS MAY HE NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE & PROGRAM DESIGNED TO CARRY OUT THE STATE LANDS COMMISSION'S ASSIGNED DUTIES UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 29, STATUTES OF 1956, 1ST EXTRAORDINARY SESSION, INCLUSIVE OF, BUT NOT THEREBY DELIMITED TO, THE FOLLOW-ING: (1) THE ESTABLISHMENT OF POSITIONS AS HEREAFTER DETAILED; (2) THE OPENING OF A STATE LANDS DIVISION OFFICE AT LONG BEACH AS REQUIRED; (3) THE EXPANSION OF THE STATE LANDS DIVISION OFFICE AT LONG BEACH AS REQUIRED; (3) THE EXPANSION OF THE STATE LANDS DIVISION'S OPERATING AND ROUIPMENT ALLOTMENTS AS MAY HE RE-QUIRED BY THE SCOPE OF THE PROGRAM; (4) THE NO TIATION OF INTERIM CONTRACTS AND INTERAGENCY AGREEMENTS WITH REFERENCE TO SUBSIDENCE EVALUATION AND ACCOUNT-ING SELVICES.

THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER IS FURTHER AUTHORIZED TO REQUEST AN EMERGENCY AUTHORIZA-TION, AS HEREAFTER SET FORTH, TO FINANCE THE PROGRAM OF WORK ABOVE RECITED, SAID EMERGENCY AUTHORIZATION TO BE PAYABLE FROM THE STATE LANDS ACT FUND.
