

MINUTE ITEM

14. APPLICATION FOR EXTENSION, MINERAL EXTRACTION PERMIT P.R.C. 1953.9,  
MERCED COUNTY ROAD DEPARTMENT, SAN JOAQUIN RIVER, MERCED COUNTY - W.O. 3286.

After consideration of Calendar Item 20 attached, and upon motion duly made  
and unanimously carried, the following resolution was adopted:

THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER IS AUTHORIZED TO EXTEND THE TERM OF PERMIT P.R.C.  
1953.9, ISSUED TO THE MERCED COUNTY ROAD DEPARTMENT, FOR THE PERIOD JULY 1,  
1959 THROUGH JULY 1, 1960, ALL OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE PERMIT TO  
REMAIN IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT.

APPLICATION FOR EXTENSION, MINERAL EXTRACTION PERMIT P.R.C. 1953.9, MERCED COUNTY ROAD DEPARTMENT, SAN JOAQUIN RIVER, MERCED COUNTY - W.O. 3286.

On August 8, 1957, the Commission approved the issuance of a permit to the Merced County Road Department providing for the removal of a total of 175,000 cubic yards of sand from two sites in the San Joaquin River in Sections 26 and 27, T. 7 S., R. 10 E., M.D.B. & M., Merced County, the material removed to be used for the construction of a proposed Federal-aid secondary road beginning at the City of Los Banos and running northerly to the Gustine State Highway. Extraction operations were to be completed prior to July 1, 1959. No material has been removed from the river bed under the subject permit.

An application has been received from the Merced County Road Department for an extension of the permit term to July 1, 1960, for the reason that bids for another Federal-aid secondary road project in the same area are being called for. The Road Commissioner reports that the extraction operations will result in a concurrent benefit to navigation, flood control and recreation.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER BE AUTHORIZED TO EXTEND THE TERM OF PERMIT P.R.C. 1953.9, ISSUED TO THE MERCED COUNTY ROAD DEPARTMENT, FOR THE PERIOD JULY 1, 1959 THROUGH JULY 1, 1960, ALL TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE PERMIT TO REMAIN IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT.
