APPLICATIONS FOR PROSPECTING PERMITS, SANTA MONICA BAY, LOS ANGELES COUNTY, C. EDWARD CHRISTOFFERSON - W.O.s 3839, 3840, 3841, 3842, 3843, 3844, 3845, AND 3846.

Applications have been received from C. Edward Christofferson of Downey, California, for eight permits to prospect for all minerals other than oil and gas on areas of tide and submerged lands seaward of the ordinary highwater mark, in the vicinity of Flatrock Point, Santa Monica Bay, Los Angeles County, including approximately 1,169 acres. (Refer to Exhibits "B", "C", and "D" attached to Calendar Item 16.)

Field reconnaissance and record review by the staff have shown that the areas for which applications have been made cannot be classified at this time as known to contain commercially valuable deposits of the minerals sought.

The applicant proposes to dredge mineral-bearing sand from the ocean floor. A mineral separation will be made on the dredge. All dredged material except salable mineral will be redeposited on the ocean floor.

The statutory filing fee of \$5 has been paid for each application, and permit fees in the total amount of \$1,169 have been deposited by the applicant.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 6818 of the Public Resources Code, the applications have been referred to the office of the Attorney General and to the Director of Natural Resources. The office of the Attorney General has advised that the applications comply with the applicable provisions of law and with the rules and regulations of the S⁺ te Lands Commission. The Director of Natural Resources has reported that the proposed operations will not interfere with the recreational use of lands littoral to the area applied for.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT, PURSUANT TO THE PUBLIC RESOURCES CODE, THE COMMISSION AUTHORIZE THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER TO EXECUTE AND ISSUE EIGHT TWO-YEAR PROSPECT-ING PERMITS TO C.
