H.R. 4390 - PROPOSED AMENIMENT TO SUBMERGED LANDS ACT - W.O. 721.

The subject bill was introduced in the House of Representatives on February 16, 1961, by Representative Overton Brooks of Louisiana and has been referred to the Committee on Judiciary. It would amend the Submerged Lands Act to establish and confirm the sequard boundaries of all coastal states as a line three marine leagues (9 geographical or $10\frac{1}{2}$ statute miles) from the coastline. Under the present wording of the Act, coastal states other than those bounded by the Gulf of Mexico are limited to three geographical miles. In the recent United States Supreme Court decision in <u>United States v. Louisiana, et al.</u> (363 U.S. 1), it was held that Texas and Florida owned submerged lands out to three leagues from their coastlines and other Gulf states were limited to three geographical miles. The subject amendment would secure equality of treatment for all coastal states, including California. The Attorney General advises the Commission that the passage of this Bill is in the interests of California.
