## THE PROPERTY

Location: Victorville is from three to eight miles southeast of the parcels. Elevation ranges between 2,660 and 3,360 feet.

Access: By public road, three-eights of a mile to two miles west to the old route of U. S. Highways 66 and 91.

Water: There is no surface water on the parcels. Wells located approximately one-fourth mile to two miles west of the parcels range in depth from 65 to 150 feet and deeper.

A 72 & 73 S 30 Cover: Sparse mesquite, brush, and cactus.

Highest Use: Desert homesites, with a secondary use for recreation.

The State's applications to select the lands have been accepted by the Bureau of Land Management, and the lands were listed (conveyed) to the State in 1960 and 1961.

This selection will be an advantage to the State in that it will assist in satisfying deficiencies under the School Land Grant.
