8. APPLICATION FOR PERMIT TO DRILL HOLES FOR SOIL TESTS WITHIN SUBMERGED LAND OF ITALIAN SLOUGH IN SAN JOAQUIN, SACRAMENTO, AND CONTRA COSTA COUNTIES; DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES - W.O. 5389, P.R.C. 3286.9.

After consideration of Calendar Item 25 attached, and upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, the following resolution was adopted:

THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER IS AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE TO THE DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES A PERMIT FOR A PERIOD OF TWO YEARS FOR TEMPORARY PLACEMENT OF A DRILL BARGE AND THE DRILLING OF TEST HOLES IN SUBMERGED SOVEREIGN LANDS ALONG ITALIAN SLOUGH FROM OLD RIVER TO CLIFTON COURT ROAD IN SAN JOAQUIN, SACRAMENTO AND CONTRA COSTA COUNTIES.

THE CONSIDERATION FOR ISSUANCE OF THIS PERMIT IS THE PUBLIC USE AND BENEFIT.

APPLICATION FOR PERMIT TO DRILL HOLES FOR SOIL TESTS WITHIN SUBMERGED LAND OF ITALIAN SLOUGH IN SAN JOAQUIN, SACRAMENTO, AND CONTRA COSTA COUNTIES; DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES - W.O. 5389.

The Department of Water Resources has applied for a permit to drill holes for soil tests in submerged land of Italian Slough from Old River to Clifton Court Road in San Joaquin, Sacramento, and Contra Counties. (See Exhibit "A".)

The work is in connection with planning for the California Aqueduct. It will consist of rotary drilling of 6-inch-diameter holes of maximum depth to approximately 40 feet. All holes will be backfilled and sealed to prevent mixing of ground water with slough water. Adjacent property owners will be contacted for permission prior to drilling of landward holes.

The consideration for issuing the permit is to be the public use and benefit.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE COMMISSION AUTHORIZE THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER TO ISSUE TO THE DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES A PERMIT FOR A PERIOD OF TWO YEARS FOR TEMPORARY PLACEMENT OF A DRILL BARGE AND THE DRILLING OF TEST HOLES IN SUBMERGED SOVEREIGN LANDS ALONG ITALIAN SLOUGH FROM OLD RIVER TO CLIFTON COURT ROAD IN SAN JOAQUIN, SACRAMENTO AND CONTRA COSTA COUNTIES.
