26. EXTENSION OF TERM, DREDGING PERMIT P.R.C. 3412.1; MARIN COUNTY; JACK HUNT WEST, JR. - W.O. 6833.

After consideration of Calendar Item 37 attached, and upon motion duly made and carried, the following resolution was adopted:

THE COMMISSION APPROVES THE EXTENSION THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 1970, OF DREDGING PERMIT P.R.C. 3412.1 ISSUED TO JACK HUNT WEST, JR., TO DREDGE APPROXIMATELY 584,000 CUBIC YARDS OF MATERIAL FROM AREAS OF TIDE AND SUBMERGED LANDS IN NOVATO CREEK, MARIN COUNTY, AT A ROYALTY OF \$0.05 PER CUBIC YARD. ALL OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE PERMIT ARE TO REMAIN IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT.

## EXTENSION OF DREDGING PERMIT

PERMIT: P.R.C. 3412.1 (approved November 18, 1965, Minute Item 12, page 11,907; however, due to difficulties, was not issued until June 1, 1967)

PERMITEE: Jack Hunt West, Jr.

LOCATION: Tide and submerged lands, Novato Creek, Marin County

ORIGINAL AMOUNT TO BE  
DREDGED AND DISPOSITION:

584,000 cubic yards to be dredged. Of this total to be removed from State lands, approximately 107,000 from one area and approximately 145,000 cubic yards from another area will be disposed of on the adjacent upland property owned by the applicant. The remainder of the material, 332,000 cubic yards, will be deposited on State property.

REASON FOR EXTENSION:

According to applicant, due to circumstances beyond control he has not been able to complete the dredging project.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- a. All State agencies have approved the project.
- b. U. S. Corps of Engineers has issued Department of the Army permit approving the project.
