14. DREDGING PERMIT, TIDE AND SUBMERGED LANDS, SAN PABLO BAY, CONTRA COSTA COUNTY; PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY - 4.0. 5848, P.R.C. 4150.1.

After consideration of Calendar Item 17 attached, and upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, the following resolution was adopted:

THE COMMISSION AUTHORIZES THE ISSUANCE TO PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY OF A PERMIT, EFFECTIVE DECEMBER 19, 1968, THROUGH DECEMBER 18, 1971, TO DREDGE 6000 CUBIC YARDS OF MATERIAL FROM AN AREA OF SUBMERGED STATE LAND IN SAN PABLO BAY, AT A ROYALTY RATE OF \$0.10 PER CUBIC YARD OF MATERIAL REMOVED, WITH SPOILS TO BE DEPOSITED ON STATE LAND ADJACENT TO THE DREDGING SITE, AS DESCRIBED IN EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED AND BY REFERENCE MADE A PART HEREOF.

CALENDAR ITEM

APPLICATION FOR DREDGING PERMIT

APPLICANT: Pacific Gas and Electric Company

DREDGE AREA LOCATION:

Waterfront area of Oleum, San Pablo Bay, Contra Costa County

TYPE OF LAND: Tide and submerged

PURPOSE: To reopen an existing channel to maintain water intake for the Pacific Gas and Electric Oleum Power Plant

REMOVAL VOLUME:

6000 cubic yards (total)

A. Legal description

DISPOSITION OF DREDGE MATERIAL: Landward of bulkhead line, adjacent to dredge area, on State land

CONSIDERATION: Royalty of \$0.10 per cubic yard for material dredged

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- 1. Dredging operations to begin immediately upon issuance of the permit.
- 2. Applicant conducted previous maintenance dredging operations under a 25-year State easement issued January 6, 1941.
- 3. A Department of the Army permit is not required
- 4. The San Francisco Bay Conservation and Development Commission has issued a permit to the applicant for the removal of 1,800 cubic yards of material, which will expire June 1, 1969, but is renewable for 6-month periods.
- 5. State agencies concerned have commented on the project as follows:
 - a. The Department of Fish and Game has no objection.
 - b. The Department of Water Resources has no objection.
 - c. State Water Quality Control Board No. 2 has no objection but states that roiling of waters and floating debris must be prevented and has requested that they be notified if material is to be deposited as hydraulic fill.
- 6. The Department of Parks and Recreation has made an examination of the proposed project, pursuant to Section 6818 of the Public Resources Code, and has no objections.

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EXHIBIT "A"

Those certain submerged lands situate in San Pablo Bay, at Davis Point, County of Contra Costa, State of California, and more particularly described as follows:

A strip of land of the uniform width of 40 feet extending northerly from the low water line of San Pablo Bay and lying equally on each side of the line which begins at a point on the line of mean low water of San Pablo Bay, which point is determined by running N. 17° 23' 30" W. 385.71 feet and N. 0° 08' 30" E. 1987.82 feet from California State Highway station 237 + 30.48 (about one mile northerly of the town of Rodeo), and runs thence from the point of beginning as so determined N. 0° 08' 30" E., 300 feet, more or less, containing an area of .28 acres, more or less.
