12. EXTENSION AND AMENDMENT OF PERMIT PRC 4395.2 TO PROSPECT FOR GEOTHERMAL RESOURCES, FIVE MILES NORTHWEST OF THE GEYSERS STEAM FIELD, LAKE COUNTY; ORVILLE FORBES, BILLEE B. FORBES, D. E. CHANTLER, ALZORA M. CHANTLER, AND LOUISE F. SADERLUND - W 95/1, PRC. 4395.2.

After consideration of Calendar Item 10 attached, and upon motion duly made and carried, the following resolution was adopted:

THE COMMISSION AUTHORIZES:

- 1. IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 6910 OF THE PUBLIC RESOURCES CODE, THE EXTENSION OF PERMIT TO PROSPECT FOR GEOTHERMAL RESOURCES PRC 4395.2, ISSUED TO ORVILLE FORBLS, D. E. CHANTLER, ALZORA M. CHANTLER, AND LOUISE F. SADER-LUND, FOR A PERIOD OF TWO YEARS OR FROM JANUARY 7, 1963, THROUGH JANUARY 6, 1975.
- 2. THE AMENDMENT OF THE PROPERTY DESCRIPTION OF PERMIT TO PROSPECT FOR GEOTHERMAL RESOURCES PRC 4395.2 AS FOLLOWS:

THE SOUTHWEST QUARTER OF NORTHWEST QUARTER (SW $\frac{1}{4}$ OF NW $\frac{1}{4}$) AND THE WEST HALF OF THE SOUTHWEST QUARTER (W $\frac{1}{2}$ OF SW $\frac{1}{4}$) OF SECTION 10, AND ALL OF SECTION 16 IN T. 12 N., R. 9 W., M.D.B.& M., LAKE COUNTY, CALIFORNIA, CONTAINING 760 ACRES MORE OR LESS.

ALL OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE PERMIT ARE TO REMAIN UNCHANGED AND IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- 1. Permit to Prospect for Geothermal Resources PRC 4395.2 was issued on January 7, 1970, for a primary three-year term to Orville Forbes, Billee B. Forbes, D. E. Chantler, Alzora M. Chantler, and Louise F. Saderlund. The permittees have requested a two-year extension for further evaluation of the data obtained during the primary term.
- 2. The described area of the permit was in error and included lands not under State ownership. It is proposed to amend the description of the permit extension to reflect correctly the permit area.
- 3. The Office of the Attorney General has advised that no environmental impact report is required pursuant to Section 6371 of the Public Resources Code as the permit extension does not constitute the issuance of a new lease. However, consistent with the Commission's policy to consider all environmental protection aspects, a notice has been sent to those who otherwise would receive an environmental impact report, informing them of the permit extension and advising that the proposed exploratory operations to be performed under such extension will not have a significant detrimental

environmental effect, and that the extension will be considered by the Commission at a public meeting, giving the time and place.

4. During the primary three-year term the following exploration work has been conducted in the area of the subject permit:

Aero magnetic and gravity survey.

Infra-red surveys.

Geothermal, geological, and geochemical studies.

Geothermal well logging.
