## SEISNIC STUDY PERMIT

APPLICANT: Physics International Company.

LOCATION: Mono Lake, Mono County.

TYPE OF LAND: Submerged.

TERM: August 30, 1973, through August 29, 1974.

CONSIDERATION: Public benefit.

PREREQUISITE ITEMS:

a. Permit from the State Department of Fish and Game.

b. Statutory filing fee paid.

OPERATING CONDITIONS:

Established by the Commission.

PERTINENT INFORMATION:

It is proposed to detonate 300 pounds of nitromethane 25 feet below the lake surface. After the detonation, six specimens deployed radially around the charge will be removed from the lake in order to study the effect of shock waves on dynamic behavior of materials and models of structures. These models of underground tunnels used at the Atomic Energy Commission Nevada Site will be analyzed to determine their collapse at various pressure levels.

## ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT:

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Pursuant to Section 6371 of the Public Resources Code, an environmental impact report, identified as EIR 110, has been prepared and is on file in the office of the Commission and available for public review. The report concludes that the proposed seismic operations will not have a significant detrimental environmental effect.
