6. 49-YEAR PUBLIC AGENCY PERMIT, SUBMERGED LAND IN THE BED OF THE COLORADO RIVER, SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY; UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR, GEOLOGICAL SURVEY - W 9421, PRC 5003.

After consideration of Calendar Item 4 attached, and upon motion duly made and carried, the following resolution was adopted:

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION:

A 10'  $\times$  300' strip of submerged land in the bed of the Colorado River 2,500' south of

Parker Dam, San Bernardino County.

LAND USE:

Operation and maintenance of an existing overhead cable-way for measuring the flow of the

Colorado River.

TERMS OF PROPOSED PERMIT:

Initial period: 49 years, from June 1, 1971.

CONSIDERATION:

The public use and benefit, with the State reserving the right at any time to set a monetary rental if the Commission finds such action to be

in the State's best interest.

PREREQUISITE TERMS:

Applicant is owner of the upland.

STATUTORY AND OTHER REFERENCES:

a. Public Resources Code: Div. 6, Parts 1 & 2.

b. Administrative Code:

Title 2, Div. 3,

Arts. 1, 2 & 10.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

1. The annual rental value of the site is estimated to be \$75.

2. An environmental impact report is not required. This transaction is within the purview of 2 Cal. Adm. Code 2910(a) which exempts an existing structure that is in an acceptable state of repair and there is no evidence of record to show injury to adjacent property, shoreline erosion, or other types of environmental degradation.

The cable-way is maintained in a good condition, and there is no indication that it has or will have a detrimental effect on the environment.

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3. The cable-way was constructed in 1971. Each end of the cable is attached on land under the ownership of the United States.
