OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- The annual renual value of the site is estimated to be \$10,000.
- The A.M. d.A. was created by a joint powers agreement between several water and water treatment districts in order to comply with water quality requirements of this State and the Mederal government. Some of these districts presently have ocean outfall lines which discharge waste water which does not meet the present State water quality standards.
