27. EXTENSION OF RIGHT OF WAY PERMIT - MP 4945.

During consideration of Calendar Item 27, attached, Mr. Robert C. Hight, Chief Counsel, explained the item. Mr. Richard Thomson, Commission-alternate, asked if there had been any previous requests for extensions. Mr. Hight said there had been three. Mr. Thomson asked if this would be the final request for an extension. Mr. Hight assured the Commission that staff would make every effort to encourage the parties involved to organize a unified fire protection district. He explained the Division is not directly involved in this matter other than that the pipeline is on State land. Mr. Thomson wanted to know it there was any real justification for this delay. Mr. Hight stated there are numerous districts and they are having difficulty in unifying. Mr. Thomson also wanted to know if there was any damage being done by this delay. Mr. James F. Trout, Manager, Land Operations, answered the question by stating that State lands were not being injured, but that the public is being dis-benefitted by 1) the unsightly look of the pipeline lay-ing on the surface of the beach; and 2) that it is somewhat of an impediment for passage along the beach.

With the understanding that future requests for extensions will not be approved if the Districts involved do not make a dilligent effort to organize a unified fire protection district, the item was approved without objection.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the resolution as presented in Calendar Item 27, was adopted by a vote of 2-0.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION;

Minute Item 8, dated August 29, 1974, authorized the execution of temporary emergency Right of Way PRC 4945.1, to Donner Pines, Inc., for a water intake pipeline capable of providing 2,000 GPM for fire protection purposes only, with a term of no longer than 6 months;

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provided that the lease will not be remewed unless affirmative action has been taken for a more permanent solution at the end of 6 months.

2. Alternatives being pursued for a more permanent solution to the existing fire hazard:

A. Granmer Engineering, Inc., p. 0. Box entered into an agreement with Donner Lake entered into an agreement with Donner Lake at Donner Lake, to provide engineering services necessary to form a local assessment district for the purpose of financing service in the area. The assessment district, solution to the existing fire hazard. However, this alternative is currently in a state of abeyance and progressing slowly.

b. Effective May 5, 1975, DLUC is charged by the authority of the Public Utilities Commission to provide for fire protection standards in its water system as set forth in amendment to PUC General Order 103 Decision No. 84334, dated April 15, 1975. Pursuant to the request of the Truckee Eire Protection District of Newada County, constideration is being given to the feasibility of acceptance by DLUC of the ownership and operation of the subject intake facility for the time period required until DLUC's proposed master plan for expansion is completed. It is proposed in the master plan that DLUC's existing "West Beach" well will be the ultimate water source for fire flow protection and domestic use. Use of the subject intake facility would be terminated upon completion of the master plan.

In an action to further the concept of this alternative, Donner Pines, Inc., et al, have conveyed to California Blue Valley, and the fire control system for operation and maintenance until such time that the of the Truckee Fire Commission.

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By letters dated April 14, 1976, the Truckee Fire Commission has advised staff their engineer has approved and does confirm that the subject system conforms to the engineering standards required by the Truckee Fire District.

Further study of this concept is being pursued by applicant and DLUC to determine the benefits will, in fact, provide a more permanent solution to the existing fire hazard during the interim until KLUC's master plan for expansion is completed.

- An Environmental Impact Report has not been prepaned for this activity as such report is not required for an emergency project of this type under the provisions of PRC 21172; 14 Cal. Adm. Code 15071; and 2 Cal. Adm. Code 2903(d).
- This project is situated on State land identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to Public Resources Code 6370.1, and is classified in a significant use category, Class B: Limited Use.

Staff review indicates that there will be no significant effect upon the identified environmental values. This is an existing facility for which no adverse comments have been received.

Nevada County Records; thence westerly along a line parallel with and 10 feet distant southerly of said southerly line of Donner Pass Road on a curve to the left having a radius of 1,550.00 feet and a central angle of 12° 35' 39" for a distance of 340.71 feet; thence S 60° 11' 00" W, 103.00 feet to a point that lies 57 feet from the westerly line of said Parcel 1; thence S 19° 08' 17" E, 358 feet, more or less, to the end of the herein described centerline.
