38. GENERAL PERMIT, RECREATIONAL USE; AUTHORIZATION FOR SETTLEMENT AND DISMISSAL OF SUIT; HARRY W. AND LEE A. ERICKSON - W 503.826.

During consideration of Calendars 37 and 38, attached, Mr. Robert C. Hight, Chief Counsel, explained the items were identical and stated that they involved two people on the river who did not have a permit for a recreational pier. He also made changes to the Resolution deleting the word "NONPREJUDICIAL" in paragraph #4.

Upon motion duly made and carried, Calendars 37 and 38 were approved without objection by a vote of 2-0, amended as follows:

THE COMMISSION:

1. DETERMINES THAT AN ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT HAS NOT BEEN PREPARED FOR THIS ACTIVITY AS SUCH REPORT IS NOT REQUIRED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF PRC 21085; 14 CAL. ADM. CODE 15101; AND 2 CAL. ADM. CODE 2907(A).
2. FINDS THAT THE GRANTING OF THE PERMIT WILL HAVE NO SIGNIFICANT EFFECT UPON ENVIRONMENTAL CHARACTERISTICS IDENTIFIED PURSUANT TO SECTION 6370.1, OF THE PUBLIC RESOURCES CODE.
3. AUTHORIZES THE ISSUANCE TO HARRY W. AND LEE A. ERICKSON OF OF A 10-YEAR GENERAL PERMIT-RECREATIONAL USE FROM MARCH 1, 1977; IN CONSIDERATION OF ANNUAL RENTAL IN THE AMOUNT OF \$40; FOR THE USE OF TIDE AND SUBMERGED LANDS IN THE SACRAMENTO RIVER, SACRAMENTO COUNTY; FOR DOCK FACILITIES ON THE LAND DESCRIBED IN EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED HERETO AND BY REFERENCE MADE A PART HEREOF.
4. AUTHORIZES THE STAFF TO SETTLE THE LITIGATION AND EXECUTE A DISMISSAL IN PEOPLE V. ERICKSON, SACRAMENTO SUPERIOR COURT NO. 263165, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE EXECUTION OF THE ABOVE PERMIT.

GENERAL PERMIT-RECREATIONAL USE  
AUTHORIZATION FOR SETTLEMENT AND DISMISSAL OF SUIT  
HARRY W. and LEE A. ERICKSON

On June 1, 1976, the State Lands Division staff filed suit against Harry W. and Lee A. Erickson. The suit sought ejectment and damages for the unlawful use of State property located on the Sacramento River, Sacramento County, approximately 3 miles north of Sacramento.

Subsequently, after some protracted pretrial litigation the defendant's agreed, in settlement, to a permit for the future use of State lands. This permit arrangement would eliminate a long standing dispute between the State and the Ericksons.

APPLICANT: Harry W. and Lee A. Erickson

LAND USE: Existing dock.

TERMS OF PROPOSED PERMIT: Initial period: 10 years from March 1, 1977.

5 year rent review, with limitations of increase to no more than 50% of existing rental and condition that if legislation is enacted reducing or eliminating rental obligation, that such would be effective in permit arrangement.

Liability insurance: \$10,000 for bodily injury, \$10,000 for property damage or \$100,000 single liability or valid homeowner's policy.

RENEWAL OPTION: None

SURETY BOND: None

CONSIDERATION: \$30 per annum.
