Staff has coordinated this project with those agencies and organizations who nominated the site as containing significant environmental values. They have found this project to be compatible with their nomination.





About 4.6 acres of right of way will have to be acquired, all but 0.3 acre of which is now occupied by a levee bearing the existing road. Determination An Environmental Study has been prepared, and it has been determined that the project will have no significant effect upon the environment for the following reasons: The project will not induce growth or significantly alter the overall appearance of the surrounding area. No change in character or volume of traffic is anticipated. No parks, recreational areas, fish or wildlife habitats 2. will be affected by the project.
