To this end, i has been tion of environmental studies, in cooperation with determined that the co-lead agencies, in cooperation with the United States Geological Survey (U.S.G.S.), will prepare the United States Geological Survey (U.S.G.S.), will prepare document which will comply with the California Environmental adocument and the provisions of the Quality Act (CEQA), as amended and the provisions of the National Environmental Policy (NEPA) as they pertain to an National Environmental assessment (EA). Thus, the document to be prepared will be an EIR/EA.

To formalize this arrangement, a memorandum of understanding (MOU), has been prepared in cooperation with the Governor's Office of Planning and Research (OPR).
