PUBLIC AGENCY USE

APPLICANT: Department of Parks and Recreation
1416 Ninth Street
Sacramento, California 95814

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION:
A 1+ acre parcel of tide and submerged
land in San Francisco Bay, adjacent to
Angel Island, Marin County.

LAND USE: Non-commercial recovery of historical artifacts.

TERMS OF PROPOSED PERMIT:
Initial period: 1 year from December 1,
1978.

CONSIDERATION: The public use and benefit, with the State
reserving the right at any time to set
a monetary rental if the Commission finds
such action to be in the State's best interest.

PREREQUISITE TERMS, FEES AND EXPENSES:
Applicant is owner of upland.

Filing fee and processing costs have not
been received.

STATUTORY AND OTHER REFERENCES:
A. P.R.C.: Div. 6, Parts 1 & 2.
B. Cal. Adm. Code: Title 2, Div. 3.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:
1. The annual rental value of the site
is estimated to be \$500.
2. This project is exempt from CEQA because
this project is primarily concerned
with experimental management and resource
evaluation activities. The aforementioned
activities will not result in a serious
or major disturbance to an environmental
resource.

Authority: 2 Cal. Adm. Code, Article 10, Section 2907, Class 6.

3. This project is situated on State land identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370.1, and is classified in a use category, Class C, which authorizes Multiple Use.

Staff has coordinated this project with those agencies and organizations who nominated the site as containing significant environmental values. They have found this project to be compatible with their nomination.

4. Staff recommends waiver of normal processing fees for the following reasons:
 - a. Transaction required minimum staff time.
 - b. All recovered artifacts will be retained in the interpretive collection of the State of California Department of Parks and Recreation.
 - c. Recovery of historic artifacts will benefit the public enjoyment and education of Angel Island State Historic Park.
 - d. Recovery of historic artifacts will greatly enhance the documentation, interpretation and understanding of the historic Immigration Detention Barracks on Angel Island.

2. FIND THAT GRANTING OF THE PERMIT WILL HAVE NO SIGNIFICANT EFFECT UPON ENVIRONMENTAL CHARACTERISTICS IDENTIFIED PURSUANT TO SECTION 6370.1, OF THE P.R.C.

3. AUTHORIZE ISSUANCE TO DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION OF A 1-YEAR GENERAL PERMIT - PUBLIC AGENCY USE FROM DECEMBER 1, 1978; IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PUBLIC USE AND BENEFIT, WITH THE STATE RESERVING THE RIGHT AT ANY TIME TO SET A MONETARY RENTAL IF THE COMMISSION FINDS SUCH ACTION TO BE IN THE STATE'S BEST INTEREST; WAIVE NORMAL FILING AND PROCESSING COSTS; FOR NON-COMMERICAL RECOVERY OF HISTORICAL ARTIFACTS ON THE LAND DESCRIBED ON EXHIBITS "A" ATTACHED AND BY REFERENCE MADE A PART HEREOF.




