APPLICATION FOR A BORROW PERMIT

APPLICANT: Department of Transportation  
District 02  
P. O. Box 21007  
Redding, California 96001

TYPE OF LAND: School lands. Department of Fish and Game  
is the surface owner. Minerals were retained  
by the State.

AREA AND LOCATION:

Primary source area will be in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$   
of NW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 22, T26N, R16E. Supplementary  
source will be in the N $\frac{1}{2}$  of Section 27,  
T26N, R16E, MDB&M, Lassen County (Approximately  
6 miles northwest of the town of Doyle  
on Highway 395).

PROPOSAL AND METHOD OF OPERATION:

To remove approximately 6,000 tons of material  
per year for seasonal highway shoulder  
repairs. Aggregates will be excavated,  
loaded with rubber-tired front-end loaders,  
and hauled by 10-wheel dump trucks to Department  
of Transportation maintenance work area  
on State Route 395. Two maintenance areas  
will be using the source (Susanville and  
Quincy). Operations are subject to certain  
restrictions specified in the permit.

CONSIDERATION: No royalty, the public use and benefit.

PREREQUISITE TERMS:

1. Filing fee has been deposited by the  
applicant.
2. The subject permit has been reviewed  
and approved by the Office of the Attorney  
General as to compliance with applicable  
provisions of law pursuant to Section 6890  
of the P.R.C.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

1. A negative declaration was prepared  
by the Commission's staff pursuant

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to CEQA and implementing regulations, and was certified by the Commission on February 22, 1979.

2. This project is situated on State land which has not been classified as possessing significant environmental values.
3. Staff has coordinated this application with the concerned agencies.
4. The area has been used intermittently as a source of aggregates for many years.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE COMMISSION:

1. FIND THAT GRANTING OF THE APPLICATION WILL HAVE NO SIGNIFICANT EFFECT UPON ENVIRONMENTAL CHARACTERISTICS IDENTIFIED PURSUANT TO SECTION 6370.1 ET SEQ. OF THE P.R.C.
2. ACKNOWLEDGE THAT NEGATIVE DECLARATION WAS CERTIFIED BY THE COMMISSION AT ITS FEBRUARY 22, 1979 MEETING, WHICH CERTIFICATE FOUND THAT THE PROPOSED PROJECT WILL NOT HAVE A SIGNIFICANT EFFECT ON THE ENVIRONMENT.
3. AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF A BORROW PERMIT FOR A TERM OF 5 YEARS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO REMOVE APPROXIMATELY 6,000 TONS OF AGGREGATE ANNUALLY FOR ROAD-SHOULDER REPAIR IN THE SUSANVILLE AND QUINCY DISTRICTS, AT NO ROYALTY THE CONSIDERATION BEING THE PUBLIC USE AND BENEFIT. PRIMARY SOURCE AREA OF AGGREGATES SHALL BE THE SW $\frac{1}{4}$  OF THE NW $\frac{1}{4}$  OF SECTION 22, T26N, R16E, WITH A SECONDARY SOURCE AREA IN THE N $\frac{1}{2}$  SECTION 27, T26N, R16E, LASSEN COUNTY. EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE PERMIT SHALL BE APRIL 1, 1979, TO MARCH 31, 1984, WITH TWO 5-YEAR RENEWAL TERMS AND SUCH PERMIT SHALL BE SUBJECT TO ANY REQUIREMENT, OR LIMITATIONS AS SET OR AS MAY BE SET BY FEDERAL, STATE OR LOCAL GOVERNMENTS.
