DREDGING PERMIT

In accordance with the Commission's delegation of authority to the Executive Officer on February 24, 1977 (Minute Item No. 32), to issue Dredging Permits of 10,000 cubic yards or less, to perform dredging on State-owned lands, the following applicant has been granted such permission:

APPLICANT: County of Riverside
Parks Department
5192 Mission Blvd.
Rubidoux, California 92519

The permit provides for excavating a maximum of 500 cubic yards of minerals other than oil, gas and geothermal, from sovereign lands in the Colorado River at Collis Mayflower County Park, Riverside County. The excavation is required to provide water exchange between the River and a previously constructed lagoon within the Park. Spoils will be used to dress low spots within the publicly-owned park at no royalty, the consideration being the public use and benefit, with any surplus to be placed on adjacent private property at a royalty of \$0.25 per cubic yard. The permit is effective from December 1, 1980 through November 30, 1981.

In compliance with said delegation of authority, it has been determined that the following conditions have been met:

1. The proposed project is categorically exempt from the requirements of CEQA, pursuant to the provisions of Section 15104 of the CEQA Guidelines as a minor alteration to land not involving removal of trees.
2. Issuance of the permit and the resultant project will have no significant adverse effect on the environment or the environmental characteristics identified pursuant to Section 6370.1 et seq., of the P.R.C.


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3. The dredging amount will not exceed 10,000 cubic yards.
4. A charge per cubic yard will be assessed for spoil material that is deposited on private property or otherwise lost to future State benefit.
5. Approval of the project will be contingent upon approval by all pertinent State, Federal and local agencies.


