GENERAL PERMIT -- PUBLIC AGENCY USE

APPLICANT: County of Stanislaus
Parks and Facilities
1416 Morgan Road
Modesto, California 95351

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION:
A 0.095-acre parcel of submerged lands
in the San Joaquin River near Patterson,
Stanislaus County.

LAND USE: Construction and maintenance of a two-lane
boat launching ramp utilized for public
recreation.

TERMS OF PROPOSED PERMIT:
Initial period: 49 years from June 1, 1981.
Public liability insurance: combined single
limit coverage of \$1,000,000
per occurrence for bodily
injury and property damage.

CONSIDERATION: The public use and benefit, with the State
reserving the right at any time to set
a monetary rental if the Commission finds
such action to be in the State's best interest.

BASIS FOR CONSIDERATION:
Pursuant to 2 Cal. Adm. Code 2005.

PREREQUISITE TERMS, FEES AND EXPENSES:
Applicant is owner of upland.
Filing fee and processing costs have been
received.

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OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

1. The annual rental value of the site is estimated to be \$190.
2. Applicant identifies this project as the "Las Palmas Launching Facility." A boat launching ramp will extend on to sovereign lands from upland which has been specifically acquired from the City of Patterson by applicant for public park purposes. This facility, when completed, will provide boaters with the sole launching access to the San Joaquin River within Stanislaus County. The project is located approximately midway between State Highway 99 on the east, and I-5 Freeway on the west, which provide statewide public access to this particular area of the San Joaquin River. The facility will be open to the public year-round without charge.
3. A negative declaration was prepared by the County of Stanislaus, pursuant to CEQA and the State EIR Guidelines. A Notice of Determination has been received.
4. This project is situated on State land identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370.1, and is classified in a use category, Class B, which authorizes Limited Use.

Staff has coordinated this project with those agencies and organizations which nominated the site as containing significant environmental values. They have found this project to be compatible with their nomination.

APPROVALS REQUIRED AND OBTAINED:

This facility is subject to the jurisdiction of the United States Army Corps of Engineers, California Department of Fish and Game, California Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board, California Reclamation

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Board, County of Stanislaus and the City of Patterson. The proposed permit is conditioned on the approval of all agencies having jurisdiction.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE COMMISSION:

1. DETERMINE THAT AN EIR HAS NOT BEEN PREPARED FOR THIS PROJECT BUT THAT A NEGATIVE DECLARATION HAS BEEN PREPARED BY THE COUNTY OF STANISLAUS.
2. CERTIFY THAT THE COMMISSION HAS REVIEWED AND CONSIDERED THE INFORMATION CONTAINED IN THE NEGATIVE DECLARATION.
3. DETERMINE THAT THE PROJECT WILL NOT HAVE A SIGNIFICANT EFFECT ON THE ENVIRONMENT.
4. FIND THAT GRANTING OF THE PERMIT WILL HAVE NO SIGNIFICANT EFFECT UPON ENVIRONMENTAL CHARACTERISTICS IDENTIFIED PURSUANT TO SECTION 6370.1, OF THE P.R.C.
5. AUTHORIZE ISSUANCE TO THE COUNTY OF STANISLAUS OF A 49-YEAR GENERAL PERMIT - PUBLIC AGENCY USE FROM JUNE 1, 1981; IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PUBLIC USE AND BENEFIT; WITH THE STATE RESERVING THE RIGHT AT ANY TIME TO SET A MONETARY RENTAL IF THE COMMISSION FINDS SUCH ACTION TO BE IN THE STATE'S BEST INTEREST; AND WITH PROVISION OF PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE HAVING A COMBINED SINGLE LIMIT COVERAGE OF \$1,000,000 PER OCCURRENCE FOR BODILY INJURY AND PROPERTY DAMAGE; FOR CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE OF A TWO-LANE BOAT LAUNCHING RAMP UTILIZED FOR PUBLIC RECREATION ON THE LAND DESCRIBED ON EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED AND BY REFERENCE MADE A PART HEREOF.

EXHIBIT "A"

LAND DESCRIPTION

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A parcel of submerged land 46 feet wide, including a 10-foot use area, in the bed of the San Joaquin River in Section 16, T5S, R8E, MDM, in Stanislaus County, California, and being a portion of Lot 167 of "Patterson Colony Subdivision Tract Number One" filed December 13, 1909 in Volume 4 of Maps, page 40, Stanislaus County Records being more particularly described as follows:

COMMENCING at the southwest corner of Lot 167 of "Patterson Colony Subdivision, Tract Number One"; thence N 19°20'W 355 feet, thence N 70°40'E 148 feet to the TRUE POINT OF BEGINNING being the center line of said 46 foot strip; thence N 70°40'E 90 feet to the end of said center line.

EXCEPTING THEREFROM any portion thereof lying below the ordinary high water mark of the San Joaquin River.

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

PROJECT TITLE: Las Palmas Launching Facility

PROJECT LOCATION: San Joaquin River and Park Avenue, 3 miles east
of Patterson.

DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT:

Will include an access road, a 20 car/trailer parking lot, two-lane launching ramp, a waterless flush type restroom, and a dusk to dawn light.

The project is designed to accomodate recreationists that frequent the San Joaquin River for boating and fishing.

FINDINGS: An Environmental Questionnaire has been completed and the Stanislaus County Environmental Review Committee has found that the project will not have a significant effect on the environment for the following reasons:

1. The project is consistent with the County General Plan.
2. The project is consistent with the area's zoning.
3. No substantial adverse aesthetic effects will occur.
4. There will be no significant growth inducing impact.

The Las Palmas facility will consist of a two-lane launch ramp, waterless flush restroom, dusk til dawn light, 20 car/boat-trailer parking area with access road. Usage is expected to be 4,000 launchings per year. Monies for the project will be funded 100% through the State Department of Navigation and Ocean Development. It will be a free use area which will be open year around.

3. Describe in detail the nature of the area in which the project will be located. List land use of the subject parcel and surrounding properties.

The Las Palmas sit is presently county park property with river access but no development. Surrounding properties are for agricultural purposes. The area is in the flood plain of the San Joaquin River with gradual to steep banks. It is located 3 miles east of Patterson at Old Las Palmas Avenue and the San Joaquin River.

To provide all recreationists an opportunity to utilize benefits derived from river access and use.
