ON JUNE 4, ON BEHALF OF THE CHAIRMAN, I ATTENDED CEREMONIES DEDICATING APPROXIMATELY 700 ACRES OF OPEN SPACE WETLANDS ADJACENT TO SUISUN BAY NEAR MARTINEZ KNOWN AS THE POINT EDITH WILDLIFE AREA. THIS AREA WILL BE USED AS A WILDLIFE HABITAT UNDER THE MANAGEMENT OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME AND WAS THE CULMINATION OF A LAND BANK AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COMMISSION AND THE TRUST FOR PUBLIC LANDS.
