APPROVAL OF GENERAL PERMIT -
PUBLIC AGENCY USE

APPLICANT: Petaluma Resource Conservation District
4228 Petaluma Boulevard, North
Petaluma, California 94952

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION:
A 9.0 acre parcel, more or less, of State owned
tide and submerged lands in Petaluma River and
Stemple Creek, Sonoma County.

LAND USE: Maintenance and improvement of existing levees.

TERMS OF PROPOSED PERMIT:
Initial period: Ten years from May 1, 1984.

CONSIDERATION: The public use and benefit; with the State
reserving the right at any time to set a
monetary rental if the Commission finds such
action to be in the State's best interest.

BASIS FOR CONSIDERATION:
Pursuant to 2 Cal. Adm. Code 2003.

APPLICANT STATUS: Applicant is obtaining permit on behalf of
upland owners.

PREREQUISITE CONDITIONS, FEES AND EXPENSES:
Filing fee and processing costs have been
received.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

1. The applicant requests the proposed permit pursuant to a regional permit granted by United States Army Corps of Engineers for periodic improvement and maintenance of approximately 15 miles of levee, along the Petaluma River and its tributary Stemple Creek, protecting primarily agricultural land used to produce oat hay. The work authorized is for levee repair and reconstruction of existing levees only, by the individual landowners under the auspices of the applicant.
2. The annual rental value of the site is estimated to be \$2,430
3. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.
4. Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (14 Cal. Adm. Code 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA as a categorical exempt project. The project is exempt under Class 4 (2) rebuilding or repair of levees including minor dredging.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE COMMISSION:

1. FIND THAT THE ACTIVITY IS EXEMPT FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE CEQA PURSUANT TO 14 CAL. ADM. CODE 15061 AS A CATEGORICAL EXEMPT PROJECT, CLASS 4(2), 2 CAL. ADM. CODE 2905.
2. FIND THAT THIS ACTIVITY IS CONSISTENT WITH THE USE CLASSIFICATION DESIGNATED FOR THE LAND PURSUANT TO P.R.C. 6370, ET SEQ.
3. AUTHORIZE ISSUANCE TO PETALUMA RESOURCE CONSERVATION DISTRICT OF A TEN-YEAR GENERAL PERMIT - PUBLIC AGENCY USE FROM MAY 1, 1984, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PUBLIC USE AND BENEFIT, WITH THE STATE RESERVING THE RIGHT AT ANY TIME TO SET A MONETARY RENTAL IF THE COMMISSION FINDS SUCH ACTION TO BE IN THE STATE'S BEST INTEREST; FOR MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT OF EXISTING LEVEES ON THE LAND DESCRIBED ON EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED AND BY REFERENCE MADE A PART HEREOF.


