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ACCEPTANCE OF RETROCESSION OF PARTIAL JURISDICTION  
AND ESTABLISHMENT OF PROPRIETARY JURISDICTION OVER  
A PORTION OF MATHER AIR FORCE BASE  
SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CALIFORNIA

Gov. Code Section 113 provides as follows:

"The Legislature of California hereby consents to the retrocession of jurisdiction by the United States of land within this State upon and subject to each and all of the following express conditions:

- (a) The United States must in writing have requested State Acceptance of retrocession, and unless there is an Officer of the United States empowered by a United States statute to cede jurisdiction, said request shall be by the act of Congress; such retrocession may return all jurisdiction to the State or may provide for concurrent jurisdiction.
- (b) When the conditions of subsection (a) of this section have been found and declared to have occurred and to exist, by the State Lands Commission, the Commission shall hold a hearing to determine whether acceptance of such retrocession is in the best interest of the State. Notice of such hearing shall be published pursuant to Sec. 6061 in each county in which the land or any part thereof is situated and a copy of such notice shall be personally served upon the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of each county. The State Lands Commission shall make rules and regulations governing the conditions and procedure of such hearings.

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- (c) The determination of the State Lands Commission shall be final and jurisdiction acceptance shall become effective when certified copies of its orders or resolutions have been filed in the Office of the Secretary of State and recorded in the Office of the County Recorder of each county in which any part of the land situated."

The United States holds partial legislative jurisdiction over approximately 6.69 acres of land at Mather Air Force Base. The land is used as a railway spur for the base. The spur lies outside of the base proper. The United States, pursuant to California Government Code Section 113, by letter dated April 20, 1984 has written to Governor Deukmejian requesting the State of California to accept a retrocession of all jurisdiction over this land. The purpose of the retrocession is to facilitate the administration of local police power over the area.

A Public hearing was scheduled in the Sacramento offices of the Commission on April 12, 1985, for the purpose of determining whether it was in the best interest of the state to adjust the jurisdiction of the United States. Notice thereof was published in the Sacramento Bee and notice of said hearing was personally served on the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of Sacramento County. Affidavits of publication and service are filed in the records of the Commission.

The hearing was held as noticed. No comments regarding the adjustment were received at the hearing.

The retrocession would be in the best interest of the State in connection with the administration of local police power over the area.

3. DETERMINE THAT A RETROCESSION OF PARTIAL JURISDICTION AND ESTABLISHMENT OF PROPRIETARY JURISDICTION OVER THE LANDS DESCRIBED IN EXHIBIT "B" ATTACHED AND BY REFERENCE MADE A PART HEREOF IS IN THE BEST INTERESTS OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA.
4. ACCEPT THE RETROCESSION OF PARTIAL JURISDICTION AND ESTABLISH PROPRIETARY JURISDICTION OVER THE LANDS DESCRIBED IN EXHIBIT "B" ATTACHED AND BY REFERENCE MADE A PART HEREOF.
5. AUTHORIZE THE DISTRIBUTION OF CERTIFIED COPIES OF THIS CALENDAR ITEM AS FOLLOWS:
  - A. ONE COPY TO BE FILED WITH THE SECRETARY OF STATE, STATE OF CALIFORNIA.

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B. ONE COPY TO BE RECORDED IN THE OFFICE OF THE COUNTY RECORDER OF SACRAMENTO COUNTY.

C. ONE COPY TO BE MAILED TO SECRETARY OF THE AIR FORCE, UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

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

LAND DESCRIPTION

All those parcels of land situate in County of Sacramento, State of California more particularly described as follows:

AS TO TRACT C301 (formerly know as Tract 2) conveyed to the United States of America by deed dated May 25, 1945 and recorded in Book 1686 of Deeds, at page 304, County of Sacramento.

All that portion of a tract delineated "John W. Booth 150 95/100" on the plat of Subdivision of the Rancho Rio de los Americanos, recorded April 4, 1866, in the office of the Recorder of Sacramento County, California, in Book 1 of Maps, Map No. 2, described as follows:

BEGINNING at the Northeast corner of the 10 acre tract described in deed from William D. Coyle, et al., to A. Teichert & Son, Inc., dated February 10, 1943, recorded in Book 100 of Official Records of Sacramento County, at page 220; thence along the North line of said 10 acre tract, North 89° 12' West 18.85 feet to a point on a line described as follows:

COMMENCING at a concrete monument at the Southwest corner at Amended Natomas American River Subdivision No. 4, according to the plat thereof, filed in the office of the Recorder of Sacramento County, California, on October 19, 1918, in Book 15 of Maps, Map No. 44; thence North 23° 38' West 168.03 feet to a point on a curve, the center of which bears North 53° 01' 20" East 746.34 feet; thence along said curve to the right, Northerly 169.92 feet; thence North 23° 56' West 220.39 feet to the beginning of a curve with a radius of 746.34 feet; thence along said curve to the right, Northerly 287.61 feet; thence North 1° 51' 15" West 65.87 feet, more or less, to said point on the North line of said 10 acre tract; thence from said point, North 1° 51' 15" West 700.84 feet, more or less, to the North line of an 80 acre tract described in a trustee's deed to J.D. Coyle, dated July 28, 1928, recorded in Book 195 of Official Records of Sacramento County, at page 442; thence along the North line of said 80 acre tract, South 89° 44' East 17.37 feet to the West boundary line of said Natomas American River Subdivision No. 4; thence along said boundary line, South 1° 59' 30" East 701.07 feet, more or less, to the point of beginning, containing 0.29 of an acre, more or less.

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AS TO TRACT C302 (formerly known as Tract 3) conveyed to the United States of America by deed dated May 26, 1945 and recorded in Volume 1890 of Official Records at page 316, County of Sacramento.

All that portion of a tract delineated "John W. Booth 150 85/100 A" on the plat of subdivision of the Rancho Rio de los Americanos, recorded April 4, 1866, in the office of the Recorder of Sacramento County, California, in Book 1 of Maps, Map No. 2, described as follows:

BEGINNING at the Southeast corner of a 84.35 acre tract described in deed from Henry Miller, Jr., and wife, to Ruth Johnson, dated December 16, 1942, recorded in Book 991 of Official Records of Sacramento County, at page 73; thence North 89°44' West along the South line of said 84.35 acre tract, 17.37 feet to a point on a line located as follows:

COMMENCING at a concrete monument at the Southwest corner of Amended Natomas American River Subdivision No. 4, according to the plat thereof, filed in the office of the Recorder of Sacramento County, California, on October 19, 1918, in Book 15 of Maps, Map No. 44; thence along the Westerly line of said subdivision, North 23°38' West 168.03 feet to a point on a curve, the center of which bears North 53°01'20" East 746.34 feet; thence Northerly along said curve to the right, a distance of 169.92 feet; thence North 23°56' West 220.39 feet to the beginning of a curve with a radius of 746.34 feet; thence along said curve to the right Northerly, a distance of 287.61 feet; thence North 1°51'15" West 766.71 feet, more or less, to said point on the South line of the 84.35 acre tract; thence from said point North 1°51'15" West 1413.94 feet, more or less, to the boundary line of said Natomas American River Subdivision No. 4; thence along said boundary line South 32°43' East 14.40 feet and South 1°58'30" East 1413.79 feet, more or less, to the point of beginning, containing 0.52 of an acre, more or less.

AS TO TRACT C303 (formerly known as Tract 4) conveyed to the United States of America by deed dated November 30, 1943 and recorded in Book 1598 of Deeds, at page 312, County of Sacramento.

All those portions of the amended map of Natomas American River Subdivision No. 4, according to the official map thereof, filed in the office of the Recorder of Sacramento County, California, on October 19, 1918, in Book 15 of Maps, Map No. 44, described as follows:

Parcel No. 1: All of Lot 77 except a strip of a normal width of 20 feet contiguous to and along the entire easterly side of said Lot 77, containing 0.90 of an acre, more or less.

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Parcel No. 2: Lot 76, excepting therefrom the following:

BEGINNING at the southeasterly corner of said Lot 76; thence along the southerly line of said Lot 76, South 59°51' West 22.22 feet to a point on a curve with a radius of 686.34 feet, the center of which bears North 79°53'40" East; thence along said curve to the right a distance of 98.84 feet; thence North 1°51'15" West 114.14 feet to a point on the easterly line of said Lot 76; thence along said Easterly line, South 9°24'30" East 203.95 feet, more or less, to the point of beginning, containing 0.78 of an acre, more or less.

Parcel No. 4: All of Lots 72, 73, 74 and 75 containing 3.23 acres, more or less.

Parcel No. 5: The West 5 feet of Lots 50, 51, 52, 53, and 54, being a strip of land of a normal width of 5 feet and lying contiguous to and along the entire Easterly line of Lots 72, 73, 74 and 75, containing 0.35 of an acre, more or less.

Parcel No. 6: The East 5 feet of Lots 41, 42 and 49, being a strip of land of a normal width of 5 feet and lying contiguous to and along the entire Westerly line of Lots 72 and 73, containing 0.20 of an acre, more or less.

Parcel No. 7: All those portions of Lots 31, 32 and 33 lying East of the following described line:

BEGINNING at a point on the North line of said Lot 31 located West 51.98 feet from the corner common to Lots 31 and 7; thence South 6°43' East 61.42 feet to a point which is West 44.22 feet from the line common to Lots 31 and 7, measured at right angles therefrom; thence South 0°32'30" West, parallel with the East line of Lots 31, 32 and 33 and the extension thereof, a distance of 1408.58 feet to a point on the line common to Lots 33 and 41, from which the Northwest corner of Lot 72 bears South 59°22' East 5.78 feet, containing 1.17 acres, more or less.

Teichert & Sons, Inc., dated June 9, 1941, recorded in book 398 of Official Records of Sacramento County, at page 156; thence along the North line of said 40.4 acre tract, South  $39^{\circ}44'$  East 15.11 feet, more or less, to the West line of said Natomas American River Subdivision No. 4; thence South  $23^{\circ}38'$  East 69.05 feet, more or less, to the point of beginning, containing 0.01 of an acre, more or less.

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AS TO TRACT C307 (formerly know as Tract 8) conveyed to the United States of America by grant deed dated May 25, 1945 and recorded in Volume 3420 of Deeds at page 563 and by quitclaim deed dated October 29, 1957 recorded in Volume 3420 of Deeds at page 569, County of Sacramento.

All those portions of the amended map of Natomas American River Subdivision No. 4, according to the official map thereof, filed in the office of the Recorder of Sacramento County, California, on October 19, 1918, in Book 15 of Maps, Map No. 44, described as follows:

Parcel No. 1: That portion of Lot 6 described as follows:

BEGINNING on the line common to Lots 6 and 71 located North  $0^{\circ}32'30''$  East 575.42 feet from the Southwest corner of said Lot 6; thence East 5.12 feet; thence South  $12^{\circ}44'30''$  West 24.21 feet to the line common to said Lots 6 and 71; thence North  $0^{\circ}32'30''$  East 23.61 feet to the point of beginning, containing 60.45 square feet, more or less.

EXCEPTING THEREFROM: Those portions of Lots 9, 33, 41, 42, 49, 50, 51, 52, 53, 72 and 73, as said lots are shown on the "Amended Map of Natomas American River Subdivision No. 4" filed in the Office of the Recorder of Sacramento County, on October 19, 1918, in Book 15 of Maps, Map No. 44, described as follows:

BEGINNING at the most Southerly corner of said Lot 33; THENCE from said point of beginning along the Southwesterly line of said Lot 33, North  $59^{\circ}52'43''$  West 65.13 feet to the Easterly line of that certain five (5) foot strip of land acquired by the United States of America as Parcel No. 5 in deed dated November 30, 1943, recorded January 15, 1949, in Book 1598 at page 312, Official Records of Sacramento County; thence along said Easterly line the following five courses: (1) South  $00^{\circ}06'14''$  East 725.41 feet; (2) from a tangent that bears South  $00^{\circ}00'43''$  East along a curve to the left with a radius of 925.37 feet, through an angle of  $28^{\circ}19'00''$ , an arc distance of 457.33 feet; (3) South  $28^{\circ}19'43''$  East 70.13 feet; (4) along a tangent curve to the right with a radius of 985.37 feet, through an angle of  $25^{\circ}58'00''$ , an arc distance of 446.57 feet; and (5) South  $02^{\circ}21'43''$  East 4.31 feet to a point distant 1125.78 feet Southeasterly, measured radially from the "B12" line of Engineer's Station "B12" 352+36.73 of the Department of Public Works' Survey on Road 03-Sac-50, P.M. 2.9/12.3; thence leaving said Easterly line, from a tangent that bears North  $02^{\circ}21'43''$  West along a curve to the left with a radius of 500.00 feet, through an angle of  $39^{\circ}41'47''$ , an arc distance of 346.41 feet to a point on the Westerly line of that certain five (5) foot strip of land acquired by the United States of America as Parcel No. 5 in

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said deed; thence along said Westerly line the following four courses: (1) from a tangent that bears North 22°16'00" West along curve to the left with a radius of 925.37 feet, through an angle of 06°03'43", an arc distance of 97.90 feet; (2) North 28°19'43" West 70.13 feet; (3) along a tangent curve to the right with a radius of 985.37 feet, through an angle of 28°19'00", an arc distance of 486.99 feet (said curve being non-tangent at the Northerly terminus); and (4) North 00°06'14" West 650.55 feet, thence leaving said Westerly line, North 16°30'15" East 68.22 feet, thence along a tangent curve to the left with a radius of 600.00 feet, through an angle of 16°28'28", an arc distance of 172.52 feet; thence North 00°01'47" East 79.22 feet to a point on the Easterly line of said Lot 33, said point being the most Northerly terminus of that certain 573.69 foot radius curve on said Easterly line of Lot 33 as shown on said Amended Map of Natomas American River Subdivision No. 4; thence Southerly along the Easterly line of said Lot 33 to the point of beginning, containing 2.17 acres, more or less.

ALSO EXCEPTING THEREFROM: That portion of said Lot 71 lying West of a line parallel with and 51.98 feet Westerly from the East line of said Lot 71, and containing 2.96 acres, more or less.

Total area described above contains 11.82 acres, more or less.

Exceptions described above contain 5.13 acres, more or less.

Total area Partial Legislative Jurisdiction described above contains 5.69 acres, more or less.
