APPROVE SPECIFICATIONS AND FORMS FOR INVITING BIDS
AND APPROVE THE AWARD OF THE CRUDE OIL SALES CONTRACT BY
THE CITY OF LONG BEACH FOR THE CITY'S SHARE OF
CRUDE OIL PRODUCED FROM CERTAIN TRACTS WITHIN THE
FAULT BLOCK IV UNIT AND FAULT BLOCK V RANGER ZONE UNIT,
WILMINGTON OIL FIELD

BACKGROUND:

The City of Long Beach has two crude oil sales contracts for
crude oil allocated to the City from certain tracts within the
Fault Block IV Unit and Fault Block V Ranger Zone Unit,
Wilmington Oil Field. Some of these tracts are tideland tracts.

One contract with Enron Corporation began on November 1, 1989
and is scheduled to expire on November 1, 1990. The tracts
covered by this sales contract are listed in Exhibit "A".

Enron is paying the City a bonus of \$0.483 per barrel above a
base price defined as the arithmetic average of prices posted
for crude oil of like gravity and quality on the day of
delivery in the Wilmington, Long Beach (Signal Hill),
Huntington Beach and Inglewood Oil Fields among the postings of
Chevron U.S.A., Inc.; Mobil Oil Corporation; Texaco Trading and
Transportation, Inc.; and Union Oil Company of California. The
City's share of production from these tracts is approximately
400 barrels per day of 19° API gravity crude oil.

Texaco Trading and Transportation Inc. is purchasing the City's
share of crude oil from tracts listed in Exhibit "B" under the
second contract which began on February 1, 1990 and is
scheduled to expire on February 1, 1991. Texaco is paying the
City a bonus for this oil of \$0.575 per barrel above the base
price as defined above. The City's share of production from
these tracts is approximately 280 barrels per day of 19° API
gravity crude oil.

The City proposes to combine these crude oil sales contracts into one new contract to commence on November 1, 1990 and which will expire on February 1, 1992. The City's share of crude oil from these tracts will be approximately 600 barrels per day of 19° API gravity crude oil. Specifications for the sale are listed on Exhibit "C".

The Long Beach City Council approved the bid package for this sale on July 10, 1990.

A notice inviting bids for the new sales contract was published in the Wall Street Journal (Western Edition) and the Oil Daily on July 17, 1990.

Bids were received and opened on August 8, 1990. Exhibit "D" contains the results of the bidding.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Under Section 10(a) of Chapter 29, Statute of 1956, 1st E.S., the specifications and forms for the purpose of inviting bids and the awarding of the contracts for the sale of Long Beach tidelands crude oil must be approved by the State Lands Commission.

Both the City of Long Beach and the SLC Auditing and Legal Units respectively, have conducted the fiscal and legal reviews of the submitted bid material. The highest responsible bidder, as indicated by these reviews, is identified on Exhibit "D". The Long Beach City Council will approve the award of the contract to the highest responsible bidder on September 4, 1990.

Staff recommends the award of the crude oil sales contract for tracts within the Fault Block IV Unit and Fault Block V Ranger Zone Unit, Wilmington Oil Field, Los Angeles County for the period November 1, 1990 until February 1, 1992 to the highest responsible bidder identified on Exhibit "D".

APPROVE THE AWARD BY THE CITY OF LONG BEACH OF THE CRUDE OIL SALES CONTRACT FOR TRACTS LISTED IN EXHIBITS A & B WITHIN FAULT BLOCK IV UNIT AND FAULT BLOCK V RANGER ZONE UNIT, WILMINGTON OIL FIELD, LOS ANGELES COUNTY, FOR THE PERIOD NOVEMBER 1, 1990 UNTIL FEBRUARY 1, 1992 TO THE HIGHEST RESPONSIBLE BIDDER IDENTIFIED ON EXHIBIT "D".

EXHIBIT "C"

Specifications of sale by City of Long Beach of crude oil allocated to certain tracts in the Fault Block IV Unit and Fault Block V Ranger Zone Unit, Wilmington Oil Field, Los Angeles County, some of which are tidelands tracts.

1. Volume

The oil is 100 percent of the City's working interest share of crude oil allocated to certain tracts within the Fault Block IV Unit and Fault Block V Ranger Zone Unit, Wilmington Oil Field, Los Angeles County. This is approximate 600 barrels per day of 19° API gravity crude oil.

2. Price

The biddable factor is a bonus bid per barrel above a Base Price defined as the arithmetic average of the prices posted for oil of like quality in the Wilmington, Long Beach (Signal Hill), Huntington Beach and Inglewood Oil Fields on the day of delivery by Chevron, Mobil, Texaco and Union.

3. Term

The contract is for a term of eighteen months commencing November 1, 1990, and expiring on February 1, 1992.

4. Surety

A Letter of Credit in the amount of Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000) is required as well as public liability and property damage insurance in amounts not less than Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000).

5. Bid Deposit

A bid deposit of \$25,000 is required which, except for the highest responsible bidder, will be returned.

6. Right to Reject Bids

The City reserves the right to cancel this offer at any time and to reject any and all bids received.
