**PUBLIC AGENCY PERMIT AND APPROVAL OF
RIGHT-OF-WAY MAP**

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION:

An approximate 0.529-acre parcel of sovereign land located
in the bed of Little River, Humboldt County.

LAND USE:

Highway purposes pursuant to Section 101.5 of the Streets
and Highways Code, specifically to widen the existing
southbound bridge at Highway 101 over Little River, three
miles south of Trinidad, Humboldt County.

TERMS OF PROPOSED PERMIT:

Indefinite period from date the permit is approved on behalf
of the State Lands Commission.

CONSIDERATION:

As set forth by Section 101.5, Streets and Highways Code and
the public use and benefit.

BASIS FOR CONSIDERATION:

Pursuant to 2 Cal. Code Regs. 2003.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- 1. A Coastal Commission Permit, No. 1-90-205, was issued for this project by the Coastal Commission on October 10, 1990.
- 2. The attached environmental analysis document, Exhibit "C", was certified for this project by the Coastal Commission under its certified program (14 Cal. Code Regs. 15251(c)).
- 3. Staff has reviewed the document and determined that the conditions, as specified in 14 Cal. Code Regs. 15253(b), have been met to enable the Commission to use the environmental analysis document certified by the Coastal Commission as an EIR substitute in order to comply with the requirements of CEQA.
- 4. This project will widen the southbound Highway 101 bridge by ten (10) feet on the west side and by five (5) feet on the east side. The project will also expand the existing road shoulders from two (2) feet in width to five and ten feet in width. The new road shoulders are necessary to bring the bridge into compliance with current design standards and to provide a safer road shoulder for bicyclists; to provide for a breakdown lane; and to provide room for evasion in the event of vehicle breakdown on the bridge.
- 5. The annual rental value of the site is estimated to be \$800.

FIND THAT AN ENVIRONMENTAL ANALYSIS DOCUMENT (COASTAL COMMISSION PERMIT NO. 1-90-205), WAS CERTIFIED FOR THIS PROJECT BY THE CALIFORNIA COASTAL COMMISSION UNDER ITS CERTIFIED PROGRAM [14 CAL.CODE REGS. 15251(c)]; THAT THE STATE LANDS COMMISSION HAS REVIEWED SUCH DOCUMENT; AND THAT THE CONDITIONS SPECIFIED IN 14 CAL CODE REGS. 15253(b) HAVE BEEN MET.
2. DETERMINE THAT THE PROJECT, AS APPROVED, WILL NOT HAVE A SIGNIFICANT EFFECT ON THE ENVIRONMENT.
3. APPROVE THE RIGHT-OF-WAY MAP FILED BY CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION PURSUANT TO SECTION 101.5 OF THE STREETS AND HIGHWAYS CODE AND AUTHORIZE ISSUANCE TO CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION OF A PUBLIC AGENCY PERMIT FOR AN INDEFINITE PERIOD FROM THE DATE THE PERMIT IS APPROVED ON BEHALF OF THE STATE LANDS COMMISSION FOR HIGHWAY PURPOSES ON THE LAND DESCRIBED ON EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED AND BY REFERENCE MADE A PART HEREOF.




LOCATION MAP
