Before we get to the subject of paramount interest, we have another matter which was deferred from the last meeting and which we promised them we would try to expedite handling. It has to do with the memorandum agreement between the City of Martinez and the State and a number of agencies, on the small craft harbor. Would you please describe the proposal, Mr. Hortig?

MR. CHAMPION: The meeting will please come to

MR. HORTIG: Mr. Chairman, as outlined in the calendar item before you, there is a proposal for an agreement between the City of Martinez, the State of California acting through the Admini trator of the State Resources Agency, the Division of Small Craft Harbors, the Department of Parks and Recreation, the Small Craft Harbors Commission, and the State Lands Commission by reason of the fact that the proposal for the development of the small craft harbor at Martinez, it is felt, will require additional area of tide and submerged lands to be authorized for occupancy by the State Lands Commission, in addition to and replacement of an existing use permit for a small craft harbor which the State Lands Commission issued approximately four years ago to the City of Martinez.

The primary difficulties with respect to the proposed term of the lease and the term of the agreement, as originally submitted, which provided for perpetual renewal, has been eliminated in conferences subsequent to the last Commission meeting. The limitation is now specified at one

option to renew for an additional period not ') exceed fortynine years; and the question as to the possible salability of
the land that was provided for in the original greement,
which on its face was not legally practicable because of statutory and constitutional prohibitions against such sale, has
been modified in the proposed form of agreement to provide
that such sale it is understood will be available or possible
only if the State law at the time of the proposed sale provides authorization for such a transaction.

Assistant Attorney General Shank, who participated in the drafting and representation of the Attorney General's Office on behalf of all of the State agencies involved, is with us here today if the Commission has any further questions as to the nature of the proposed agreement. Before those questions are raised, it is now the recommendation of the staff of the State Lands Commission that the resolution, which follows the calendar item which you have before you, be approved by the Commission, which would authorize three things: The approval and execution of the Memorandum of Agreement between all agencies; the issuance of a new lease for an expanded area, larger than that currently under permit to the City of Martinez; and for termination by mutual consent of the existing permit, which becomes surplusage and would be a duplication of part of the area being authorized under the new lease.

This resolution is recommended on the particular bases that it is clearly stated that the State Lands Commission

1 has not been a party in the negotiations resulting in this . 2 Memorandum Agreement, has not been heretofore directly involved in the development of the harbor; whereas other parties 3 4 of the agreement, being the other State agencies and the City of Martinez, feel it is essential that the Lands Commission, 5 8 as the agent for the land owner, be represented; and the Com-7 mission desires to cooperate for the benefit of these other 8 parties. It is recommended that this documentation now be 9 approved.

MR. CHAMPION: The reason that this was deferred was because we had certain legal problems with the length of the lease and the renewal option. Those have all been satisfied and everybody is now in agreement on this? Is that the case, Mr. Shank?

MR. SHANK: Yes, sir.

MR. CHAMPION: Why don't you come forward, so all the members of the Commission can question you. Governor Anderson, do you have a question?

GOV. ANDERSON: Yes, I have a question here on the indeterminate time of the lease, with the forty-nine plus forty-nine plus forever clause. I was just trying to read it here now. It is my understanding this would just give them a forty-nine year lease, plus the option to renew it just once.

MR. SHANK: That's right.

GOV. ANDERSON: So we are talking about an extent of time of ninety-eight years. It could not go beyond that?

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1 GOV. ANDERSON: If at the time the State law permits 2 it. 3 MR. SHANK: The agreement ends in ninety-eight years 4 so there would have to be a new agreement negotiated at that time. 8 GOV. ANDERSON: My next question -- maybe Mr. Hortig 7 can answer it: Senator Miller called me on this and Assembly-Q man Waldie called me, and I understand they have been working with this. Are they in agreement with these new terms? 10 MR. HORTIG: Yes, they were at a meeting held just 11 this week. Senator Miller attended and concurred in the 12 resolution. 13 Any further questions? MR. CHAMPION: 14 I move approval. MR. CRANSTON: 15 GOV. ANDERSON: Second. 16 MR. CHAMPION: It has been moved and seconded. Is 17 there any further question? (No response) Stands approved. 18 MR. SHANKI: Thank you, gentlemen. 19 MR. HORTIG: Mr. Traynor, attorney for the City of 20 Martinez, would like to make a statement, Mr. Chairman, 21 MR. TRAYNOR: I just want to say on behalf of the 22 City of Martinez we very much appreciate the Commission's action 23 taken today. It is a great step in the development of the 24 harbor of the Gity of Martinez and we look forward to having 25 that development in full. 26
