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EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: Item 2

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ACTING CHAIRFERSON RASMUSSEN: Is a two-parter. EXECUTIVE OFFICER DEDRICK: -- is a two-parter, as you say. Paramount Oil Company which has won two royalty oil sale bids, one at Huntington Beach and one at Elwood in Santa Barbara County, they went bankrupt. They went into involuntary bankruptcy. I don't remember exactly when. I've been so wrapped up in this thing for the last couple of three weeks that my time's gone. At any ate, we were very concerned that we would lose the revenue from those sales which is somewhere in the area of \$6 million.

After a good deal of work and they finally went into Chapter 11 and various things happened, we have found two other companies who will take those assignments and carry the liabilities to protect the Spate.

So the purpose of this is your approval of those two assignments of royalty oil sale.
