1 Control Board is in support of this. It will get the
2 treated effluent out thirty-two hundred feet away from any
3 beaches. Although, there's nothing toxic or contaminant in
4 the effluent.

5 CHAIRMAN DAVIS: Does anyone care to speak on this
6 item?

7 EXECUTIVE OFFICER HIGHT: No. We have no --

8 CHAIRMAN DAVIS: I'd just like to comment possibly
9 on Chevron's willingness to do this. It shows good corporate
10 citizenship on the environmental groups who work with Chevron
11 and with the Lands Commission to achieve this harmonious
12 result.

13 ACTING COMMISSIONER PARKER: I would agree.

14 COMMISSIONER McCARTHY: Yes.

15 CHAIRMAN DAVIS: That's unanimously adopted. Item
16 fifty-seven.

17 EXECUTIVE OFFICER HIGHT: Item fifty-seven,
18 Mr. Chairman, is the authorization for staff to enter into
19 Timber Salvage Agreements to salvage timber that has been
20 infested with bugs and beetles because of the drought in
21 Shasta, Modoc and Plumas counties and the revenue from this
22 project would go into the STRS fund. This again is a project
23 that I think will help the environment and provide some jobs
24 in the local communities.

25 CHAIRMAN DAVIS: Is anyone here to speak on this

1 item? Any opposition to it?

2 ACTING COMMISSIONER PARKER: Move.

3 CHAIRMAN DAVIS: Comments?

4 ACTING COMMISSIONER PARKER: I think this is another
5 example, both of these items are examples of good government,
6 good activities on the part of this community and this has
7 nothing -- seems to have nothing but benefit particularly
8 with reforestation activities and the monies that we derived
9 to go to STRS. I think it's a very positive item.

10 CHAIRMAN DAVIS: Leo?

11 COMMISSIONER McCARTHY: I agree.

12 CHAIRMAN DAVIS: Again I want to commend the staff
13 for helping negotiate us to this result, and I'm happy to
14 note that a number of jobs will be created because of it and
15 the environmental interest respected as well. So since we
16 have a motion, that will be deemed unanimously adopted and
17 passed.

18 EXECUTIVE OFFICER HIGHT: And that's all the items
19 to come before the Commission, Mr. Chairman.

20 CHAIRMAN DAVIS: Good.

21 ACTING COMMISSIONER PARKER: Good job.

22 CHAIRMAN DAVIS: We can't have these long meetings.

23 (Laughter.)

24 CHAIRMAN DAVIS: Thank you very much.


